Job specification/skills for the post of Teacher of English

Four reasons why you may wish to join our Meols Cop High School learning community:

- We are an oversubscribed school where staff are valued, supported and allowed to develop, encouraged to innovate and given every opportunity to enjoy their teaching and share ideas across the curriculum. Our increasing numbers have meant that we are able to employ extra teachers and expand our curriculum.
- If you are an NQT, you will be given a subject mentor, SLT mentor and be offered a range of inhouse coaching and inset.
- You may be a learning tutor responsible for the welfare and progress of approximately 25 students. All staff participate in co-curricular days, charity events, support inter-form and work amazingly hard to support our students. They are our greatest resource.

- We want our students to be cognitively active and think. Can you push their thinking beyond their comfort zone and open up new learning horizons?

- You will be expected to teach at all key stages and be adept at teaching both language and literature, you will have a thirst for developing your subject knowledge a
